Road Project at C.P.A.

Church Planters to America is in it's 17th year of ministry. Thirteen years ago we built our mission headquarters building. We felt this was the year to tackle a major situation. That was to upgrade our 1/4 mile gravel road. The sand filler had washed away leaving us with a layer of round stones that caused havoc to cars and tires. After plowing snow in the winter, it created the monumental task of raking all those stones back on the road so we could mow the grass and repeat the process.

After much prayer, discussion and good old common sense it was decided, by our Board of Directors, to pave the road with black top and avoid the same situation in a few years. Since our road is a private road it is not cared for by the town. We put together all the funds we could. Some gifts were given and we came up with about \$18,000 toward the need of \$39,000 to have a commercial grade paving of the road. When we found that we could use \$21,000, interest free, to do the complete job, we felt led to do so.

As we all realize, the only income C.P.A. gets is what is given by individuals and churches for missionary support, operating expenses and upkeep of our property and facilities. Other then our Annual Retreat, this is the first time, since we built our headquarters building in 1999, that we have asked for help for a major project.
