I knew George and his wife, Ginny, for about 40 years. He was a faithful friend, supporter and encourager in the ministry of C.P.A. George went to heaven on February 17th. George will be greatly missed, but I will always remember George saying, "AMAZING," when he talked about God's faithfulness.
